Theme: The Inhabited Arctic: Lands, Peoples and Scholarship in the Circumpolar North.

Preamble:

The University of the Arctic (UArctic) is one of the largest university networks in the world with over 170 member institutions. It facilitates collaboration, resource sharing and capacity building among higher education institutions and most university institutions interested in the Arctic. UArctic members are committed to the production and sharing of new knowledge. The circumpolar network is the only one of its kind, fostering sustainable development and knowledge exchange in the Arctic region for the benefit of the North, as well as the whole world.

We, the assembled leads of UArctic member institutions declare:

- 1. We see higher education, science, scholarship and shared knowledge as keys to building human capacity among northerners and strengthening their ability to determine their own futures, and to creating a generation of future northern leaders; [Meeting theme]
